## 4-H Camp Youth Leadership Team Code of Conduct



## 4-H Youth Leadership Team Members agree to:

- stay with assigned group at all times
- follow directions given by educators and site supervisor
- maintain personal care and wear appropriate clothing as outlined in Colorado 4-H Dress Code.
- never be alone with children, especially one child
- respect others in what you say or do. Youth leaders shall never use inappropriate language while at camp
- no cell phone use at camp
- greet parents and children at the beginning of the day and acknowledge them at departure.
- be involved and engaged with campers throughout the entire day
- never use physical punishment, restrain, or force a child
- keep camper's information confidential
- use equipment and supplies in a safe and appropriate manner
- never do or say anything that campers might perceive as teasing and/or bullying. Teasing and bullying are not tolerated and are grounds for dismissal from the program. Reporting to educator or supervisor any observations of bullying in camp is essential.
- create a safe and fun environment
- notify an educator if a child is injured. Leadership team members are not permitted to administer first aid.
- report problems to supervisors concerning campers and staff and use the appropriate chain of command
- see that all campers are involved in all activities. Make certain that no one feels excluded.
- never post any camp information or photos on social media or in text messages
- refrain from inappropriate conversations in front of campers
